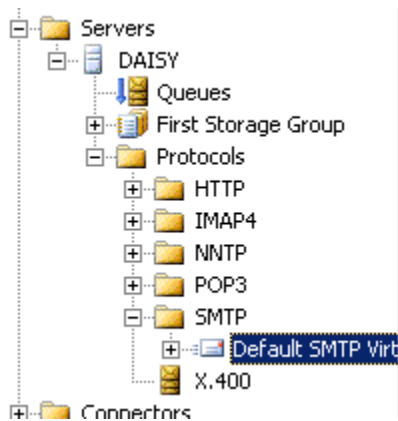


ExchangeDefender IP Restrictions

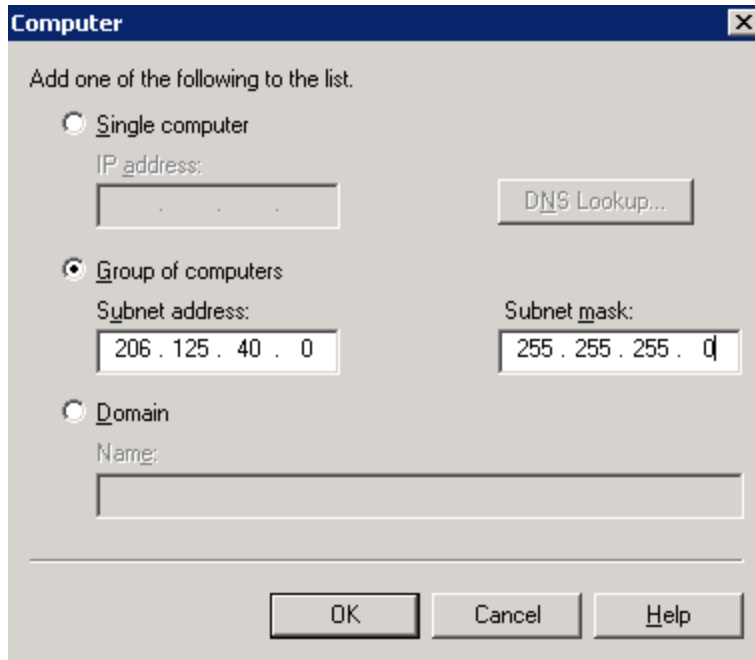
The following guide illustrates how to add a new IP address range to your IP restrictions configuration. Please note that IP address restrictions are not required for ExchangeDefender, but they are highly recommended. If you're enforcing IP restrictions you must add the following range by March 29th, 2010: 206.125.40.0/24

Exchange 2003

1. Open Exchange System Manager
2. Expand Servers, **servername**, Protocols, SMTP
3. Go to properties on Default SMTP Virtual Server
4. Go to the Access Tab and then click connections



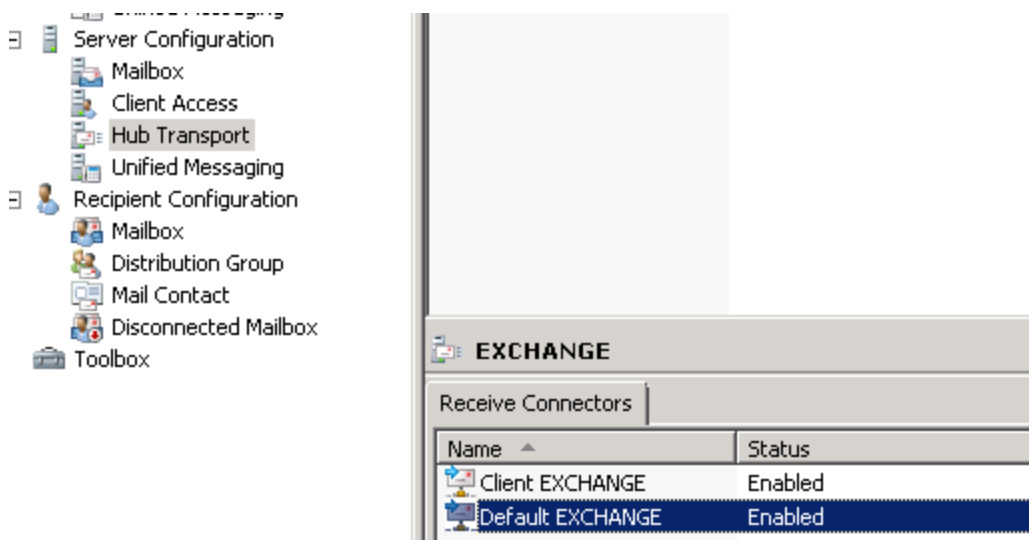
5. Click Add on the IP restrictions and select Group of computers. The subnet address is 206.125.40.0/24



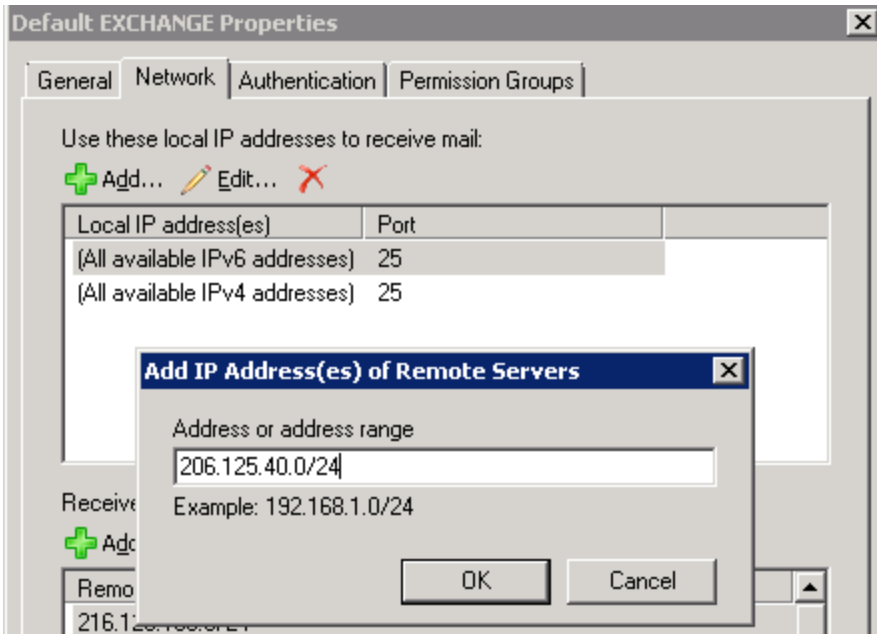
Confirm that you still have at least 65.99.255.0/255.255.255.0 and 64.182.140.0/255.255.255.0 present. Do not remove any IP ranges.

Exchange 2007

1. Open Exchange Management Console
2. Expand Server Configuration and select Hub Transport



3. On Exchange 2007 select Default **servername** receive connector and go to properties
 - a. On SBS, the connector may be called SBS **servername** Internet
4. Navigate to the Network tab and click add on **Receive Mail from remote servers that have this IP address** and set the IP as 206.125.40.0/24



Confirm that you still have at least 65.99.255.0/255.255.255.0 and 64.182.140.0/255.255.255.0 present. Do not remove any IP ranges.
